## **Thirtieth Annual KMI Architectural Awards Program**

(Frankfort, Kentucky) The Kentuckiana Masonry Institute's Annual Architectural Awards Luncheon was held Wednesday, April 21, 2010 at the Frankfort Country Club, in Frankfort, Kentucky. The program was developed to recognize excellence in architectural design. Awards were presented to the architect(s), structural engineer, mason contractor, general contractor, and owner of the winning projects, in each of seven categories: the "M" Honor Award for Overall Excellence in Masonry Design, the Brick Award of Honor, (2) Brick Awards of Merit, the Concrete Masonry Award of Honor, the Stone Award of Honor, the Stone Award of Merit, and three Special Projects Award of Merit. The jury consisted of John Calhoun, AIA, LEED AP, Studio C Architecture - Design; James Kennon, AIA, LEED-AP, Kennon Architects; David Brown, AIA, JJC Architects, all from Nashville, Tennessee who met to decide the winners on February 25, 2010.

The "M" Honor Award was presented to K. Norman Berry Architects., Louisville, Kentucky, for their design of St. Luke's Chapel, Episcopal Church Home, Louisville, Kentucky. The mason contractor was Masonomics, Inc., the general contractor was F.W. Owens Company, and the owners were Episcopal Church Home, Inc.

The Brick Award of Honor for their design of UofL Clinical and Translational Research Building, Louisville, Kentucky, went to Arrasmith, Judd, Rapp, Chovan, Inc., Louisville, Kentucky. The consulting architect was SmithGroup, Inc., the mason contractor was River City Development, and Messer Construction was the general contractor. The University of Louisville received the award for the owner.

The Brick Award of Merit was awarded to Sherman Carter Barnhart Architects, Lexington, Kentucky, for the design of Bryan Station High School. The general contractor was D.W. Wilburn, Inc., and River City Development was the mason contractor. The owner's award was presented to Fayette County Public Schools.

Another Brick Award of Merit was given out to JRA Architects, Louisville, KY for their project, Grayson County Judicial Center. The general contractor on the project was D.W. Wilburn, Inc., Charles Masonry was the mason contractor, and Grayson County Fiscal Court accepted on behalf of the owner.

The recipient of the Concrete Masonry Award of Honor was RossTarrant Architects, Inc., Lexington, Kentucky, for their design of the Sherman Elementary School, located in Dry Ridge,

Kentucky. The general contractor was D.W. Wilburn, Inc. and Grant County Schools received the owner's award.

The Stone Award of Honor was designated to Pearson and Peters, Lexington, Kentucky, for the design of St. Paul Catholic Church Baptismal Font, in Lexington, Kentucky. The general contractor was Annis and Dreyer Construction and the mason contractor was Martina Brothers Company. The project owner was St. Paul Catholic Church and Roman Catholic Diocese of Lexington.

The Stone Award of Merit was given to JRA Architects for their design of the Livingston County Justice Center, Smithland, Kentucky. The general contractor was B.H. Green and Son, Inc., the mason contractor was Allied Masonry, and the owner was the Livingston County Fiscal Court.

Rowland Design, Inc., Louisville, KY won the Special Project Award of Merit (Landscape) for the Oval Commons, University of Louisville, Louisville, Kentucky. The landscape architect on the project was CARMAN. The general contractor was TEAM Contracting, LLC, and the mason contractors were The Decorative Paving Company and A&D Masonry. The University of Louisville accepted the owner's award.

The Special Project Award of Merit (Residential) went to Murphy + Graves Architects, Lexington, KY for the Knight Residence design in Jefferson County, Kentucky. The landscape architect was Wee Landscape Architects, the general contractor was Parish Contracting Corporation, and the mason contractor was Pat Young Masonry. Dr. Doug and Donna Knight received the owner's award.
